**Post 911 GI Bill Improvements Signed**

On January 4, 2011 President Obama signed improvements to the Post-9/11 GI Bill. The most significant to most veterans are the following:

- Pays for on-the-job training; apprenticeship training and correspondence courses;
- Allows Reservists and Guardsmen to receive credit for their time supporting emergencies called by their state governors to qualify for education benefits;
- Provide one half of the national average for housing allowance to distance learning students ;
- Pro-rates the housing allowance to exclude payments when students are not in class;
- Allows students on Active Duty to receive the stipend for books and supplies;
- Allows eligible Veterans who are participating in VA Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (VR&E) benefits to choose between the GI Bill housing allowance or VR&E's subsistence allowance;
- Permits reimbursement for more than one "license and certification" test; and
- Reimburses fees to take national admission tests (SAT, ACT, GMAT and LSAT)

**VA Health Care Enrollment Opportunity for Combat Veterans**

A combat Veteran who was discharged or released from Active Service on or after January 28, 2003 have a 5-year enrollment period for VA Health Care that began upon separation or release from the most recent discharge date. You may complete or download the 10-10EZ form at the VA health eligibility website at [www.1010ez.med.va.gov/sec/vha/1010ez](http://www.1010ez.med.va.gov/sec/vha/1010ez). Or, contact VA at 1 (877) 222-8387 (VETS), visit the VA health eligibility website at [www.va.gov/healtheligibility](http://www.va.gov/healtheligibility) or apply for health care benefits at any VA medical center with the help of a VA health care eligibility specialist, or contact your Post Service Officer.

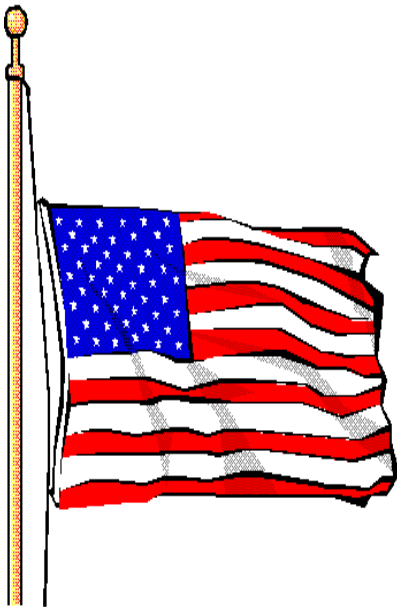
