Dear VFW Post Canteen Members,

In the last newsletter, I informed you that due to increased operating costs and the current economic conditions, the Post Canteen’s kitchen was closed. **I am happy to inform you that the kitchen is once again open for evening meals and Sunday brunch.**

Since other articles in the newsletter discuss the kitchen operations, I will devote this article to the “laws” that the VFW Canteen must obey as a private club, in order to retain our licenses for liquor service, food sales, and gambling of Small Games of Chance.

First, **in order to retain our liquor license we may only sell alcoholic beverages to members of the VFW Canteen.** This includes Active members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, members of the VFW Ladies Auxiliary, and Social members of our VFW Canteen. By law, social membership in another VFW Post’s Canteen is not transferable and cannot be honored in our Post’s Canteen. This is why all members of our Canteen are issued a VFW Post 9639 Canteen Inc. membership card. This is also why all alcoholic beverages must be purchased by our Canteen members for their guests. If our Canteen staff were to sell an alcoholic beverage to a non-member of the VFW Canteen, it would be a violation of the PA Liquor Code, and would subject the server and the Canteen to fines and a possible revocation of our liquor license. For this reason, our Canteen staff will ask to see your Canteen membership card prior to serving alcoholic drinks. Please understand that they are only doing their job to protect themselves and the VFW Canteen.

Additionally, now that the kitchen operation is leased to Manada Hill Inn Inc., Canteen members and their guests may purchase food, but the general public cannot enter the VFW Canteen and purchase food. This is a private club and if we were to serve the general public, the VFW Canteen would be required to be “smoke-free” to be in compliance with Pennsylvania’s “Clean Air Act”. Our Active VFW Post membership elected to maintain our VFW Post Canteen as a smoking facility; therefore, as a private club, we may not be open to the public and permit smoking in any part of the Post Canteen.

By law, the Canteen may allow certain functions to be open to the public, such as the Ladies Auxiliary Ham dinners or the renting of the banquet room for a wedding reception, birthday party, or funeral wake; however, during these functions open to the public or privately rented, the entire Canteen must be “smoke-free”.

Additionally, the Canteen’s House Rules are posted on the wall in the Post Canteen in order to ensure that the Canteen is an enjoyable club for our members and guests.

I hope this clarifies any misunderstanding as to why certain policies are enforced. In order to keep the kitchen operation open, we hope our Canteen membership utilizes the Canteen as often as possible, bring guests along for a meal, and encourage friends to obtain memberships.

We appreciate that our members are supporting the VFW Post and Canteen. The Shellsville VFW Canteen is only as good as our membership collectively supports it.

Thank you for continuing to support YOUR club.

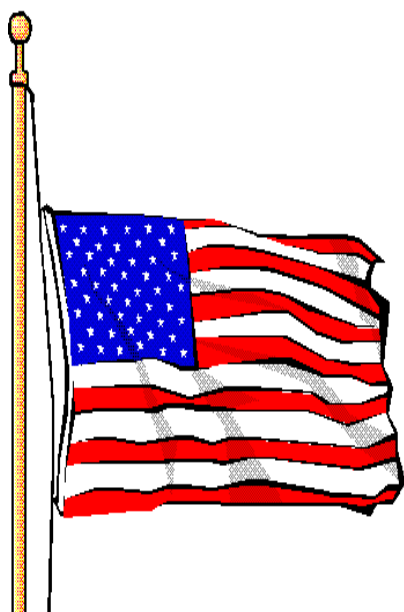
